1ST PHIP SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

(Excerpted from the Tradewind Times, July 2009)

If you have access to the Club Leaders List, you might have seen the short report on the winners of the first annual PHiP Scholarship Contest. The process for this award started in 2008 at the annual face-to-face board of directors meeting. It was proposed that among our many donations to charity, that starting in 2009 we would establish a scholarship for members or member's kids or grandkids. The board gave suggestions as to how they envisioned the scholarship; I took those ideas and added to them by "stealing" other scholarship systems. (Actually, everyone with whom I consulted gladly gave me all the information I wanted.) The BoD approved the criteria and the application in late 2008.

We established a time line, made the application and criteria available to the club leaders, and asked for submissions. (We had no idea how many we would get; I guessed about 30 ---- we got 63.) The BoD suggested various members' names for possible judges, and the five I contacted all agreed to do the work. It is our tradition to allow judges like these to be anonymous, so I will not reveal who they are, but I'll list one accomplishment for each one, and let you know all are members of at least one club:

One is the registrar of a Midwestern College.

One is an award winning public school teacher on the West Coast.

One works for a major Fortune500 company.

One is a Federal Government Employee.

One is the head school counselor in a large school in a large school district.

All did a great job!

One area on the application requested a short essay for each of three questions. Also requested was a listing of activities, both in school and in the community. We also requested the school grade transcripts for High School or College, showing at least the last three years as a minimum. And, the students could submit p to three letters of recommendation. We were looking for junior parrot heads with a good head on their shoulders, and a big heart in their chests. Here are the winners in order:

Melissa Price 21, is a member of COPA (OKC, OK club), and lives in Tulsa, Oklahoma. She will attend school in Oklahoma at Northeastern State University as an undergrad. Award \$5,000

Aileiah Clarke 27, a member of the Virtual PHC, who lives in Key West FL and will attend Saint Leo University in the Key West Campus, she will be a graduate student working on an MBA. Award \$3,000
Julia McGrath 17, her mother, Joan Bianchi, is a member of the Tampa Bay PHC. Julia will attend Florida State as a freshman. Award \$2,000

Please understand that these three young people were not the best of the general school population, they are the three best from a group of outstanding students.

All of us should be proud to know any of the 63 applicants, and to know of their accomplishments.


NISSAN CONCERT RECORDING

Cancer has become part of the daily lives of most American families. With continued research and the discovery of treatments, in the future the disease could be controlled, and will be curable. My name is Abel Suarez. I am 24 years of age. I was born on Bartow, Florida, and moved to Pennsylvania at the age of four.



After graduating from Grove City High School in 2003 my mom and I moved to Gettysburg, PA, where I met Kirsten Shull. Kirsten, age 25, is my girlfriend and has had cervical cancer.

The cancer is presently in remission, but to be safe the doctors told us, in order for us to have a child of our own, we needed to conceive now. We had a short time span in order to conceive, and things were a bit rough, but through a miracle we are expecting our child

in February. After the baby is born Kirsten's child bearing organs will be removed in order to hopefully prevent the cancer from returning.

I am representing The Hanover Area Parrot Head Society's Relay For Life Team as Luscious Lolita the Parrot Head Princess. This will be our third year of participation and my second year of doing the Miss Relay Contest. My pictures were taken at Leer Photography, where Kirsten and her cousin tortured me with seven different changes of clothing, but I kept saying it is for a good cause. When my child is old enough, I will share with him what his daddy did to help with the fight against cancer, and what his mommy did to bring him into this world.

I am participating in the Miss Relay contest as a fun way to raise money for a serious problem. Please help with my efforts by donating money in my name. By working together we can continue cancer research and hopefully put an end to this horrible disease that affects the lives of almost every American family. In this way, maybe my unborn child will live in a world without cancer.

PLAYING FOR CHANGE

The Inspiration:

Playing for Change is a multimedia movement created to inspire, connect, and bring peace to the world through music. The idea for this project arose from a common belief that music has the power to break down boundaries and overcome distances between people. No matter whether people come from different geographic, political, economic, spiritual or ideological backgrounds, music has the universal power to transcend and unite us as one human race. And with this truth firmly fixed in our minds, we set out to share it with the world.

The Production:

We built a mobile recording studio, equipped with all the same equipment used in the best studios, and traveled to wherever the music took us. As technology changed, our power demands were downsized from golf cart batteries to car batteries, and finally to laptops. Similarly, the quality with which we were able to film and document the project was gradually upgraded from a variety of formats-- each the best we could attain at the time—finally to full HD.

One thing that never changed throughout the process was our commitment to create an environment for the musicians in which they could create freely and that placed no barriers between them and those who would eventually experience their music. By leading with that energy and intent everywhere we traveled, we were freely given access to musicians and locations that are usually inaccessible. In this respect, the inspiration that originally set us on this path became a co-creator of the project along with us!

The Effect:

Over the course of this project, we decided it was not enough for our crew just to record and share this music with the world; we wanted to create a way to give back to the musicians and their communities that had shared so much with us. And so in 2007 we created the Playing for Change Foundation, a separate 501(c)3 nonprofit corporation whose mission is to do just that. In early 2008, we established Timeless Media, a for-profit entity that funds and extends the work of Playing for Change. Later that year, Timeless Media entered into a joint venture with the Concord Music Group. Our goal is to bring PFC's music, videos and message to the widest possible audience.

Now, musicians from all over the world are brought together to perform benefit concerts that build music and art schools in communities that are in need of inspiration and hope. In addition to benefit concerts, the Playing for Change band also performs shows around the world. When audiences see and hear musicians who have traveled thousands of miles from their homes, united in purpose and chorus on one stage, everyone is touched by music's unifying power.

And now, everyone can participate in this transformative experience by joining the Playing for Change Movement. People are hosting screenings, musicians are holding benefit concerts of every size, fans are spreading the message of Playing for Change through our media, and this is only the beginning. Together, we will connect the world through music!







How to Green Your Home, Work and Community by Nancy H. Taylor. The author has some great tips.

1. Green your home with compact fluorescents (CFLs) light bulbs
Change your non-dimmable light bulbs from incandescents to compact fluorescents.

CFLs come in all shapes and sizes and even many shades of the color spectrum; so you do not have to have a white glare or even use the curly bulbs. Incandescent bulbs are going to be obsolete soon, so educate your kids about how much energy CFLs save.

Because CFLs have a trace of mercury in the bulb, they must be disposed of at a recycling center.

2. Green your home by reducing the temperature of your water heater

Turn down the temperature of your water heater to 120°. If your water heater is not insulated, wrap an insulating blanket around it. If your water heater is gas, and not insulated, be sure to leave room for the air vent. Do not cover any venting pipes with a blanket.

3. Green your home with an energy audit

Arrange to have an energy audit for your home or apartment, which can be done through most utility companies or through an independent contractor. This audit will tell you where and how you are wasting energy, or areas that are lacking insulation. If you follow some of the suggestions, it is possible you can get a rebate from the utility and possibly a federal or state tax credit.

4. Green your home by reducing the amount of heat and electricity you use

Get a programmable thermostat for your furnace or home heating system. If your home or apartment is vacant all day, setting the heat to turn down while you are gone will save you money and energy. Also, turn the heat down at night. Adjust your air conditioner, so that it cools to a warmer temperature in the summer. Use shades to keep heat in during the winter and out during the summer. In the summer, open windows at night to let the cool night air in, then close windows and curtains to keep the house cool all day.

5. Green your energy use by reducing your consumption

Turn off lights and the TV when you leave a room. We are used to leaving appliances running even when we don't need them.

Appliances that run unnecessarily:


- 🌱 Draw energy
- 🌱 Cost us money
- 🌱 Create carbon dioxide

When you buy an appliance, be sure it is Energy Star rated; there are ratings for everything from air conditioners to Xerox machines.

6. Green your energy use by using a power strip

Involve everyone in the family in using power strips. Any gadget that has a digital readout or transformer box on its power cord needs to be plugged into a power strip and then turned off when not in use. They include:

- 🌱 Computers
- 🌱 Printers
- 🌱 DVD players



- 🌱 TVs
- 🌱 I-pods
- 🌱 Phone chargers
- 🌱 Adding machines
- 🌱 Coffee makers
- 🌱 Microwaves
- 🌱 Paper shredders

Just about any device draws power even when it is turned off. If you plug the devices into a power strip and then turn the power strip off at night or whenever your computer or TV is not in use, you can save up to 10% on your energy bill.

7. Green your home by reducing your carbon footprint

Try walking, biking and more. Try to minimize the carbon-producing transportation patterns of your family.

- 🌱 Take public transportation
- 🌱 Carpool
- 🌱 Ride your bike for more than just recreation
- 🌱 Join your neighbors for shopping trips, meetings or events
- 🌱 When you fly offset the carbon footprint of your trip by buying green tags.

8. Green your home with organic, sustainable local food and change your shopping habits

Food buying patterns use energy too. Most food travels 1500 miles from farm to fork. See if you can find food that was not transported from far away. Many stores carry local produce from neighboring farms.

- 🌱 Read the labels on fruits and vegetables to see where they were grown
- 🌱 Buy in bulk
- 🌱 Avoid foods that use large amounts of packaging
- 🌱 Buy from a farmers market or a community supported agriculture (CSA) farm

🌱 Bring your own bag to the market. Stop using plastic bags for supermarket shopping. Plastic is a petroleum product

9. Green your home by reducing water consumption

Water is another source of energy use; it needs to be heated for showers and washing dishes.

- 🌱 Take shorter showers or put a shut-off valve on the shower to turn it off while soaping, shampooing or shaving
- 🌱 Put a water-saver nozzle on your showerhead and all faucets
- 🌱 Use cold water to wash your clothes and dry your clothes on a rack or a clothesline
- 🌱 Turn the water off when brushing your teeth, (a great way to teach kids about not wasting water) or while shaving

10. Green your home by reusing water

Using potable water from the hose to water lawns and plants can deplete your water supply, especially if you are in a drought region of the country.

- 🌱 If you live in a place where you could collect rainwater, catch it in a barrel and use it for watering plants and landscaping.
- 🌱 If you are landscaping, plant drought resistant plants using a method called xeriscaping.

SO JIMMY WALKS INTO A BAR...

Finding Ilo

This being Jimmy Buffett, the bar is on some remote corner of the map, in this case Cape Verde, the Portuguese archipelago off the coast of West Africa. Jimmy was touching down in his plane like Indiana Jones on his way from Puerto Rico to Bamako, Mali on the first part of a journey that would take him to Timbuktu, the Sahara Desert, Morocco, Ireland, and New York, an adventurer's holiday.

He was traveling with his longtime confederate Kino, Spock to Jimmy's Kirk, and four other friends, including MTV godfather Tom Freston and music legend Chris Blackwell, the man who produced "The Harder They Come," brought Bob Marley to the world, and whose Island Records gave a home to everyone from Cat Stevens to U2.

The travelers dropped their bags at a hotel and went off to look for food, liquor and music. They hit a few saloons and found great music everywhere. It was like Cape Verde was Beale Street, Memphis 1955, everybody was a musician.

But even in this player's paradise, one young man stood out and knocked the world-weariness out of these music veterans. Ilo Ferreira was called onto the small stage at a local restaurant where everyone seemed to know everyone else. Ilo was young, looked like a college senior and handsome. He showed quiet confidence as he picked up his guitar and adjusted his microphone. Then he started to play and sing and Buffett leaned forward. Ilo had the high, beautiful voice of the young Sam Cooke, effortless charisma, and a natural grace on the guitar. He sang what sounded like an old soul classic none of the visitors could place. Turned out Ilo wrote it. With every song he played, the excitement of Jimmy's crew grew. Where did this kid come from? Could he really be THIS good?

Now, when friends on vacation get together in a saloon to drink and gab, it's pretty common for big plans to be laid and big promises to be made. Bar talk very rarely gets beyond the bar. That night, Jimmy talked with Ilo and his band, even his father, about how good the young man was. Jimmy's companions imagined out loud bringing the kid to America and putting him in a real recording studio. Jimmy just asked Ilo if he would come to lunch the next day, and bring his guitar.

Ilo said sure, and the next day the visitors asked him to play again in the sober light of day. When he finished they were even more excited. Blackwell and Freston agreed, Ilo really was THAT good. Jimmy and Ilo exchanged emails and phone numbers and promised to keep in touch. Jimmy said to his friends, "I'd really love to bring this fella to America and give him a shot. He's just great."

Now, here is where Jimmy Buffett is different from everybody else in the music business. He didn't forget that ambition when he got back to the States. He did not leave his enthusiasm behind when the plane took off. He stayed in touch with Ilo. He played a tape of Ilo's songs to big time record executives and producers. Other people saw what Jimmy had seen on that island off the coast of Africa. The kid had IT.

Jimmy arranged some studio time for Ilo in Nashville and hooked him up with a name producer who heard what Jimmy heard. Then Buffett got his big brainstorm. The first two weekends in September he was playing his biggest headlining shows ever to just under 60 thousand people a night at the New

England Patriot's stadium outside of Boston. What if he brought Ilo over and put him on the show? How would it be for a young singer from Cape Verde to step out on stage with the Coral Reefer Band behind him and 60 thousand Parrot Heads in front of him? It would sure be a test of fire. If Ilo could get through that initiation, he really could become what Jimmy glimpsed. The airline lost Ilo's clothes between Cape Verde and Boston. Ilo just smiled and said it was fine. He was good in t-shirt and jeans. Ilo was unflappable. Rehearsing with Jimmy and the band, he was open, quick to learn and a sharp listener. He did not seem to have any nerves about his big premiere. On the day of his US debut he climbed into the back seat of one of the vans caravanning from Boston to the stadium and promptly fell asleep. The kid was beyond cool, he had the confidence of a pro.

If anything looks bigger than a football stadium packed with fans, it's a football stadium when it's empty. Ilo wandered out of the van and into the empty arena. He said, "It's really big," as casually as a man looking at an elephant. Jimmy called him up to soundcheck. Jimmy's stage was about twice the size of the restaurant where Ilo played on Cape Verde. Would the kid be able to fill the space? That was a trick it took some performers years to learn. The road crew fitted tiny monitors into Ilo's ears. Jimmy started leading the band through one of Ilo's songs. Ilo swung his guitar behind his back like Johnny Cash, planted his feet like Bruce Springsteen, threw his head back and sang like Marvin Gaye.

Buffett just laughed. No problem.

Six hours later, after dark and half way through an ecstatic show, Jimmy told the crowd about meeting Ilo in Cape Verde and then asked his young friend to come out on stage. Ilo sang with Jimmy on a Buffett song, "My First Look," and then, to the surprise of the audience, stepped to the mike and did one of his own "Let Me Love You," while Jimmy slipped into the backing band. Women down front were dancing and waving at the charismatic stranger. Everybody got it. Ilo smiled, bowed and moved off-stage where he studied the rest of the show from the wings like a talented young athlete watching an all star. Moments after singing to more people than he had ever seen in one place in his life, Ilo had demeanor of someone who knew he could go all the way, and was patient to figure out the requirements.

After the concert, Jimmy Buffett was jubilant. "How about Ilo?" he kept asking everyone. "He really pulled it off!" Newspapers covering the concert wondered about the talented young singer Buffett had brought over from somewhere off the coast of Africa.

What would happen next with the mysterious Ilo?

Ilo was on his way back to Cape Verde, with a ticket to meet Jimmy in Nashville in October. Time to get the kid in the studio. He played his first American show to sixty thousand people and acted as cool as if he were singing for his friends in a small room back home. Stardom is a mysterious thing, some people who deserve it never get it and some who don't seem to become famous anyway. You can never say for sure that someone is going to become a star.

But talent, that's something different. Talent makes itself known. Thanks to the guy who walked into the bar, Ilo Ferreira's talent was about to make itself undeniable to the world.

MARGARITA CUPCAKES

Summerzcool's on fall break, but these yummie treats will bring back thoughts of a deck party or beach somewhere!

Cupcakes:

9 ounces liquid Margarita mix (a little over a cup)
3 ounces tequila (a little less than 1/3 cup)
3/4 ounce Grand Marnier

1 box white cake mix
3 large egg whites
2 Tbsp vegetable oil
1 Tbsp lime zest

Lime Buttercream Icing:

2 sticks unsalted butter, at room temperature
5 to 6 cups powdered sugar
2 Tbsp fresh limejuice
1/8 tsp salt

1 tsp grated lime zest
Green food coloring, if desired
Small lime slices for garnish, if desired

1. Preheat oven to 350° F. Line two dozen cupcake tins with paper liners.
2. Prepare cupcakes: Whisk together margarita mix, tequila and Grand Marnier in a small bowl. Measure out 1/4 cups for the recipe, pour the rest on some ice and drink it while making the cupcakes.
3. In a large bowl, blend cake mix, egg whites, vegetable oil, lime zest and 1/4 cups of the margarita mix from Step 1. Blend on low for about 30 seconds and then increase speed to medium and blend for two additional minutes. Batter will be slightly lumpy.
4. Spoon the batter into cupcake liners (about 3/4 full). Bake for 20-25 min, or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Let cupcakes cool for about 10 minutes in the pans, then remove them to a rack to cool completely.
5. Prepare icing: Once cupcakes are completely cooled, prepare the icing. Place butter in a large bowl and beat with electric mixer until butter is fluffy. Add 5 cups of powdered sugar, salt, limejuice, and lime zest. Mix until thick and creamy. Add more powdered sugar until the frosting is of a good spreading (or piping) consistency. Mix in a tiny amount of green food coloring or gel paste if you'd like the frosting to have a green tint. Ice cupcakes in whatever manner you prefer. Use small lime slices as garnish and perhaps a shot of tequila as well. Yield: About 24
