

### The Company Story

Our story actually begins many years ago in 1978. I had just bought my first 35 mm camera, a Minolta XG-7, I was proud of it and I wanted to buy a classy looking camera strap. I looked for some time, but found while there were many camera straps available, I couldn't find one that I thought was worthy of being on my new camera. That may sound snobby, but I also noticed that the straps available at that time usually had a lot of metal hardware that would scratch the camera. Some people don't care, but when I get something new, I like to take care of it. So, I went to the closest Tandy Leather Store here in Indianapolis and I bought the softest black leather I could find. This happened to be cabretta leather which was even softer than some glove leather. I hand cut the pieces and then my wife, Dena, sewed it together. We didn't know at that time but the Action Custom Camera Strap had just been born. Later, in the 1980's, because of the positive reaction to my camera strap and one which I made for a friend, we decided to try and make a business of making and selling custom camera and then later, guitar straps.

However, in late 1986 we made the decision to suspend all operations with Action Custom Straps. We had found that it was too expensive to advertise to get individuals to write for information and then order a strap and it was too long a process as well. We were selling at wholesale, and paying a commission to a sales representative, it was hard to make much money on an item that we carefully handmade. But although we "suspended" all operations with Action Custom Straps, we still couldn't get it out of our minds that there had to be some way to make it work. In the meantime, the years rolled on by.

In 1999 Levi, our son, then 19, had taken an interest in collecting guitars and so when we made the decision to open Action Custom Straps again, this time taking advantage of the opportunity the internet offers, guitar straps became our main focus. The Guild (D-35) that you see in a couple of the pictures of our guitar straps is mine. I bought it when Levi was born in 1980. The old Harmony Monterey shown in some of the pictures was my father's. He bought it sometime in the 1940's. We still offer custom camera straps, and although we have redesigned them to better show off the full snakeskin inlay they are very close to the original design.

## WOUNDED WARRIORS ON JIMMY'S BOAT

### Wounded Warriors Have a Great Time on Buffett's Boat

Fishing off South Florida has been good, but one of the best trips of the past week was extra special because of the fishermen, the fish they caught and the boat they caught them on.

Greg Kidney, Jon Pruden, Chris Gordon and Luke Murphy, who were all seriously wounded while serving in the U.S. Army in Iraq and are involved with the Wounded Warrior Project, caught kingfish, bonito, a blackfin tuna and dolphin, then concluded their trip with a yellowfin tuna doubleheader.

They kite-fished with live pilchards and goggle-eyes in 100-145 feet off Boca Raton on Margaritavich, singer Jimmy Buffett's 43-foot sport fishing boat, with Capt. Vinnie LaSorsa and Capt. Tyler Andresen.

Although LaSorsa, of Lighthouse Point, who runs Margaritavich, and Andresen, of Cape Cod, Mass., who runs Buffett's motor yacht, have fished all over and caught everything from blue marlin to bluefin tuna, this trip ranked as one of their most memorable.

"To do all that on a day when you have four Wounded Warriors, I don't know what you call that," LaSorsa said. "Divine intervention?"

The Wounded Warrior Project ([woundedwarriorproject.org](http://woundedwarriorproject.org)) helps injured servicemen and women and their families make the transition to civilian life. That includes getting them medical care, making them aware of programs that are available to them, helping them line up jobs and getting them involved in activities such as wheelchair basketball, biking, skiing, fishing and hunting.

LaSorsa had found out about the Wounded Warrior Project from his brother, Joe, who is a lieutenant in the U.S. Marine Corps and who told LaSorsa how the organization had helped some of his fellow Marines who had been injured in the line of duty.

"Both Tyler and I have great respect for those who serve our country and fight for the liberties we all take for granted every day," LaSorsa said. "I'm very fortunate. I have a great job, and I work for one of the coolest bosses anyone could work for, I'm friends with all my colleagues and for that I'm grateful, which at the same time makes me want to give so much back to those who fight for our freedom."

LaSorsa contacted the Wounded Warrior Project and said he wanted to take some veterans fishing. He got a call back from Pruden, of Gainesville, who is the organization's area outreach coordinator for the southeastern United States. (Contact Pruden with offers of assistance at [jpruden@woundedwarriorproject.org](mailto:jpruden@woundedwarriorproject.org).)

LaSorsa's plan was to take Pruden and the others fishing on his family's 35-foot center console. When he asked Andresen to come along, Andresen asked if LaSorsa had told Buffett about the trip.

"I told him I had not mentioned it and Tyler reminded me about what a huge supporter Mr. B is of the Wounded Warrior Project and that he would think it's really cool," LaSorsa said.

Sure enough, Buffett immediately said they should take the men fishing on Margaritavich because it would be more comfortable for them.

They left Hillsboro Inlet at 7:30 a.m. and went to Boca, where kingfish 10-15 pounds skyrocketed on the kite baits right off the bat. After catching a bunch of kings and a few bonito by at 9

a.m., LaSorsa and Andresen, who took turns running the boat and working the cockpit while the anglers worked the kite baits and hooked the fish themselves, put out only goggle-eyes to prevent the smaller bonito from biting. Gordon, of Clermont, caught a blackfin tuna, which was followed by more kingfish and bonito and a small dolphin.

At 11:30, Kidney, of Gainesville, and Murphy, who attends Florida State, each caught a dolphin of 20-25 pounds. Just after noon, while in 110 feet, yellowfin tuna slammed the left short kite bait and the right long kite bait. Pruden and Murphy each landed a 56-pounder, which was quite a feat on 20-pound line. "It was an amazing opportunity and a heck of a lot of fun," said Pruden, who had fished offshore only once before. "Vinnie and Tyler were just awesome, great guys. It was amazing that Jimmy offered his boat.

"I was thrilled and I can't wait to do it again."

Neither can LaSorsa.

After he told Buffett, who was on tour in California, how the trip went, Buffett told him: "When I'm not in town and you're not with my family, I can't think of a better way for you to spend your time than by taking the Wounded Warriors fishing."

## MAC DONATES SINGLE ROYALTIES

### Wounded Warriors To Receive Proceeds From Release

(NASHVILLE, Tenn.) Newly signed Show Dog Nashville recording artist and eminently respected music maker Mac McAnally has pledged to donate all his artist royalties from his debut single "You First" released on April 27 to the Wounded Warriors Project, whose mission is to honor and empower wounded warriors. The commitment to helping wounded soldiers fits well with the song's theme of brotherly love.

The single, which is available through all digital music retailers, is prelude to a full album expected to be completed in June as McAnally works recording into his touring schedule. A longtime member of Jimmy Buffett's Coral Reefer band, Mac has been on the road much of this year.

Of course, it was Mac who wrote the recent No. 1 hit "Down The Road" for Kenny Chesney. And Chesney is so enamored of Mac's hugely successful body of work he brought him into the studio to add his vocals to the song.

"Mac McAnally is the best kind of songwriter," Chesney said recently.

"With a couple chords and few lines, he opens up whole worlds... worlds that are exactly where you came from, places you know by heart and people who made you who you are today. It is so simple, yet nobody else can take you to those places -- or make you feel so at home in the space of three minutes. But that's why Mac is the songwriter everybody wishes they could be."

And with the release of "You First" and the donation of its proceeds to those in need, Mac McAnally has the chance to contribute even more than he already has with music alone.

## THE GREEN MILE

**Key West business goes the extra mile to operate with the environment in mind.**

It's hard to hear the word Margaritaville without the melody "Wasting away again in Margaritaville ..." drifting to mind. But Margaritaville is trying to convince its employees and customers not to "waste away" if they can help it. Margaritaville Store employees have been working with a sustainability consultant to find ways to "green" the business and reduce its carbon footprint.

Sunshine Smith, who runs Margaritaville Store operations, said the company always has operated with the environment in mind, but wondered if more could be done. "We always did recycle," said Denise Di Salvo, a Margaritaville Store employee and member of its Giving Back Committee, "It just wasn't as formal or as organized."

A year ago, the Giving Back Committee decided to add Environmental Giving to its program of donating 5 percent of net profit back to the community every month. But wanting to do more to reduce waste, Smith contacted Jennifer Woofter of Washington D.C. based Strategic Sustainability Consulting. Woofter's company specializes in helping other companies identify ways to become more green, and develop a strategic, step-by-step plan to accomplish each of its goals. "There's a lot of organizations feeling like they want to go green, they understand why they should do it, but they're just not sure what that first step should be," Woofter said. "One of the things we always do when we start with a client is we do a carbon footprint analysis to help them figure out as an organization, what is your contribution to the global problem of climate change."

The carbon footprint takes into account things such as how big your office is, electricity bills, how many miles people are driving in their daily community, any air travel, water usage, how many computers are running and for how long, and business travel, among many others. From there, Woofter created a list of ways the company could reduce waste, and a timeline in which to complete each task.

"The neatest part was to see what we've been doing already, and what things we could immediately and easily change," Smith said. "I think the hardest thing for most people is 'how do I start' and 'what do I do'."

Margaritaville's unofficial green team has been busy tackling the other initiatives, including switching to rechargeable batteries and compact fluorescent bulbs, using eco-friendly cleaning products, recycling, encouraging employees to walk or bike to work, receiving faxes through e-mail, and cutting back on paper mailings. Employees also have started taking the practices into their homes. Margaritaville even provided shower timers to help reduce water use and reusable grocery bags.

"In Margaritaville's case, the staff is extremely enthusiastic," Woofter said. That speaks very highly of how motivated everybody is.

## ECO DRIVING

These tips and more can be found on EcoDriving.com. Adapt your driving style with some of these and you will save at the gas pump and reduce your personal carbon footprint.

### **TIP # 1: Believe You Can Reduce Fuel Use and Emissions**

Many of the best practices for green driving are subtle, but they can add up over a year. Making small changes in your driving can be the most effective way to reduce fuel use and carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) emissions, and the best part is you can do it today, with whatever vehicle you are currently driving. What you monitor, you manage...so start adapting a "lead foot" to a "feather foot" and keep track of the savings over several tanks of gas. Typically, practicing moderate levels of EcoDriving can reduce fuel use by an average of 15%.

### **TIP # 2: Avoid Rapid Starts and Stops**

Rapid starts and stops, often called "jack rabbit" starts and stops, use fuel and costs money at the gas pump. Gentle acceleration and braking can save more than \$1 per gallon, according to the U.S. EPA, because smart driving can improve fuel economy by up to 33%. A few seconds of high-powered driving can use as much gas as driving for several minutes at more measured speeds. Ease into accelerations and brake smoothly, especially around corners, to raise your mileage the most. Avoid tailgating.

### **TIP # 3: Keep on Rolling in Traffic**

Slow-and-go is always better than stop-and-go, and not just to reduce traffic congestion woes. Maintaining a constant speed in your commute increases fuel economy, because it takes much more energy to move a stopped vehicle than to keep a vehicle moving. In fact, it can take 20 percent more fuel to accelerate from a full stop than from 5 miles per hour. Drivers who try to achieve the highest mileage possible, often called "hypermilers", practice looking ahead down the road to anticipate stops and to coast as much as possible. Computers make our lives easier in many ways, including reducing fuel use. By purchasing an "E-Z" pass for a toll road or bridge, a driver avoids stopping and starting the vehicle and idling in lines. Special lanes allow drivers to maintain a cruising speed through the toll. This saves time and money at the pump.

### **TIP # 4: Ride the "Green Wave"**

Traffic lights are often synchronized so that a motorist driving at a specific speed will pass through a series of green lights without stopping. Driving more quickly means you arrive sooner at a light and need to stop. A steady speed often can help drivers avoid red lights, therefore keeping the car moving more efficiently.

### **TIP # 5: Use Air Conditioning at Higher Speeds**

Air conditioning can reduce mileage significantly, by as much as 20%. In fact, your air conditioner can consume up to one gallon of gas per tank to cool the vehicle. But driving with your windows open can produce aerodynamic drag, which reduces fuel economy. What's a driver to do? When driving at slower speeds (less than 40 mph), such as driving in urban areas, open windows are better. At higher speeds (over 40 mph), open windows use more fuel than the air conditioner, so close the windows and turn on the air conditioner. Another good idea is to take advantage of the "recycle inside air" feature. The air that is already cooled in the car is reused by the air conditioning system, instead of drawing hot air from the outside to be cooled.

### **TIP # 6: Maintain Optimum Highway Speed for Mileage**

Highway driving that exceeds 60 miles per hour uses more fuel. According to the U.S. EPA, every 5 miles over the 60 mph level is equivalent to paying 20 extra cents per gallon for gas. Observing the speed limit and not exceeding 60 mph can improve mileage by 7-23%.

### **TIP # 7: Avoid Idling**

Curbside idling uses fuel, but because the car is going nowhere, it translates into **0 mpg**. An automobile may burn more than half a gallon of fuel for every hour spent idling. Unless you are simply dropping off or picking up someone, make it a habit to turn your engine off when waiting at the curb even if it's just for a short period. ### **TIP # 8: Use the Highest Gear Possible**

Automobiles are designed to start in the lowest gear possible, because that's where they have the most power, however, power means fuel consumption, according to Edmunds.com. By using overdrive gearing where possible, such as on the highway, your vehicle's engine speed goes down, saving fuel and engine wear while reducing CO<sub>2</sub> emissions.

### **TIP # 9: Drive Your Vehicle to Warm It Up**

Today's automobile does not need a warm-up period before driving it. Even on the coldest morning, running your engine for 30 seconds is all you need before your vehicle is ready to drive. This is enough time for the oil to circulate throughout the engine. Your vehicle will reach its optimum operating temperature much faster when you are driving, rather than idling. Today's engines are designed to run most efficiently when warmed up, so you want to warm up the vehicle by driving it. During the first few minutes of driving when an engine is cold, try to avoid sudden or severe acceleration. Take advantage of a warm engine by "trip chaining", or grouping your trips together. ### **TIP # 10: Keep Your Cool**

The inside of a vehicle heats up quickly in summer sun, reaching 120° - 130° in just 10 minutes. That can mean more air conditioning use, and that means more fuel use. Now, keeping your cool reduces carbon dioxide emissions too. So, always roll down the windows when getting into a hot car to blow out the hot air. Try to park in the shade. And consider investing in a heat reflector or window shades to shield your vehicle's interior from the sun. Parking in your garage instead of outdoors can help keep your vehicle cooler in the summer.

### **Tip # 11: Remove Excess Weight**

Avoid keeping unnecessary items in your vehicle, especially heavy ones. An extra 100 pounds in your vehicle could reduce your MPG by up to 2 percent. The reduction is based on the percentage of extra weight relative to the vehicle's weight and affects smaller vehicles more than larger ones.

### **TIP # 12: Obey your Check Engine Light**

Today's automobiles have sophisticated onboard diagnostics systems that continually monitor the operation of your vehicle. When the check engine light comes on, there is the possibility that your emissions are increased and your fuel economy is going down. Replacing a faulty oxygen sensor could result in a fuel economy improvement of as much as 40%.

## EVERYBODY'S COUSIN IN MIAMI?

It's a bit weird hearing the broadcast of a Philadelphia Phillies baseball game against the Florida Marlins from Landshark Stadium in Miami.

## WHY DON'T WE SINK THIS AND DIVE

**KEY WEST, Florida Keys** Upon first sight of the Gen. Hoyt S. Vandenberg being prepared to be scuttled as the southern anchor of the Florida Keys Shipwreck Trail, former crew member Chuck Garrison, who served on the ex-U.S. military missile-tracking ship remarked, "Wow! This will be one *helluva* wreck to dive."

Once on the bottom, the Vandenberg will measure 10 stories high in the water column, the keel the deepest, at 140 feet. It is at the top of the structure that most of the ship's interesting attributes are located, some purposely cut from one part of the ship and welded elsewhere to make attention-getting dive spots from bow to stern, all trimmed to reach within 40 to 50 feet of the surface.

Starting from a vantage point at the bow and moving aft, the kingpost and foremast are immediately eye-catching, and surely to be a popular underwater photo op for dive buddies, and can serve as a rest platform or perhaps a decompression stop on ascension from deeper dives.

Continuing aft, the bridge symbolizes the ship's intriguing maritime history: at the top of the wheelhouse a telescope has been mounted, which was part of the star-tracking systems during Vandenberg's active duty.

Behind the bridge is the smaller of two iconic radar dishes. Next, the No. 1 barbette, a heavy steel structure in the shape of a pedestal used to protect artillery gun turrets on military ships. Aft of the No. 1 barbette is the larger radar dish, which in the 1999 movie "Virus" provided quite an explosive sequence when a laser from space blew the dish off the ship. It's indeed intact though, secured to the vessel and ready for fish to shelter and breed.

All dive spots along the top structure are open, free from obstruction and should be easy to maneuver over and around during a dive.

Further aft is the trimmed part of the foremast with the crow's nest, as well as the bottom half of the ship's smokestack — the other half, trimmed to approximately 20 feet tall for an even profile along the ship's superstructure, now sits atop the weather balloon hangar at the stern. Likely to be one of the most visited dive sites on the Vandenberg, this balloon hangar will be loosely dubbed the "underwater Margaritaville," a clubhouse tribute to the famous Parrotheads who have contributed support to the Vandenberg project, aside from being fanatical fans of Jimmy Buffett, whose musical and literary fame has saturated Key West.

Though the Vandenberg will be a safe, enjoyable dive for all experience levels of certified divers, those trained and experienced in light-wreck penetration can expect to explore the ship's many cargo holds, stair towers, elevator shafts and hallways.

At 100-plus feet, holes cut along the outside of the hull to help sink the ship provide swim-through opportunities for advanced and skilled technical divers; yet the properly certified and trained wreck diver will be able to swim a full 475 feet along the starboard section of Deck 1.

Though it is unlikely divers underwater will be able to see end to end because the ship is nearly two football fields long, it is possible that one dive on the Vandenberg could reveal both shallow and

deep-water fish such as Goliath grouper and sailfish, attracted by the clouds of bait expected to school around the wreck. Of course, it will take multiple dives to get a real sense of its scale. And over the course of decades the ship is to be densely populated with coral species, sponges, invertebrates, sea fans and sea whips. Divers will want to make this Florida Keys Shipwreck Trail entry in their logbook over and over again to see the progression of marine ecosystems as they develop. Garrison, who attests to Vandenberg's past, said, "There is quite a history with this old girl, a lot of miles under her belt." The ship is expected to sit upright on the ocean bottom. According to National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration projections, the "Vandenberg" artificial reef will result in an annual increase of about \$7.5 million in expenditures in the Monroe County economy, and will create about 195 full and part-time jobs.

## How to Make a Conch Shell Horn

Excerpted from Thurlow Weed, Key West Arts Review, Vol. II No. 1, 1977

Making the instrument is neither involved nor difficult. Approximately one inch of the tip of the shell is cut off using a rotary blade moving at high speed. Then the inner spiral, thus exposed is pried out with a screwdriver. The spiral must be removed to unblock the cup-shaped opening at the top of the shell, which should then resemble a deep trumpet mouthpiece. The edges of the cut may be lightly ground or rubbed down to relieve any sharpness.

Properly cut with the inner spiral snapped off any conch shell without defects can be played. Some shells produce a greater range of notes than others. The Florida Horse Conch, *Pleuroploca gigantea*, is much more flexible as an instrument than the Queen Conch, *Strombus gigas*, due to the shape of its opening. The *Strombus* has a narrow and elongated aperture while the *Pleuroploca's* is more rounded and relatively shorter from top to bottom. Due to this difference the hand can reach deeper into *Pleuroploca* than *Strombus*.

The shell is then held in the left hand and blown as a trumpet, but of course there are no valves. Pitches are changed by inserting the right hand into the opening of the shell at various depths. The deeper the hand, the lower the note. No two shells are identical. Some are easier to play, others have better tone, and still others may have a greater musical range. The size of one's hand must be matched to the shell size of the to optimize the amount of air displaced when the hand is inserted.


