LOVE IN THE LIBRARY

There is a significant collection of Mr. Buffett's writings in the collection of the University of Florida Smathers Library.

Special Collections: Jimmy Buffett Papers, 1975-1993

10 Boxes, 5 linear feet

Acquisition: Gift of Jimmy Buffett, June 1, 1993

Biographical/historical note:

The grandson of a sea captain and son of a Navy shipbuilder, singer/songwriter Jimmy Buffett's music and writings are full of references to sea life also by way of his drunken-sailor persona. Raised in Mobile, Alabama, Buffett moved to New Orleans after his high school graduation to attend college where he worked as a guitarist and vocalist performing folk music and composing his own music. In the late 1960s he moved to Nashville, to enter the music business.

While writing for Billboard magazine Buffett performed locally and signed a recording contract with Barnaby Records. He settled near Key West, Florida, living for a time aboard his ketch, island-hopping and smuggling marijuana. In 1977 his gold record "Margaritaville" was released. Tales from Margaritaville, a collection of humorous short stories and personal anecdotes, was published in 1990.

He had previously written a children's book, The Jolly Mon (1988), with his daughter Savannah Jane, but Tales from Margaritaville was his first full-length book. He followed it in 1992 with the novel Where is Joe Merchant? establishing his storytelling talents not only in music, but in literature. Although he still maintains his drunken-sailor persona in his work, he devotes a great deal of time and his work's proceeds to philanthropic activities. (Source: Contemporary Authors Online. Scope and content:

The bulk of the Papers are drafts and galleys of Tales from Margaritaville and Where is Joe Merchant?, accompanied by notes and some related correspondence. The Papers also include five non-professional videotapes of performances, a contract for a concert at the Euphoria Tavern in Portland, Oregon, a list of fiction and non-fiction books with Buffett's favorites indicated, thank you letters for philanthropic activities, and a list of scholarship recipients at the Cincinnati Public Schools.

Arrangement:

Tales from Margaritaville (Boxes 1-2); Where is Joe Merchant? A Novel Tale...(Boxes 3-10); Videotapes (Box 2) and Miscellaneous Records (Box 10). Provenance: Acquired June 1, 1993, gift of the author. Literary rights are retained by Jimmy Buffett. July 11, 2003

Jerry Jeff Walker was the host of the TNN TV show "Texas Connection," that explored all things music in Texas. Jimmy Buffett and Greg "Fingers" Taylor were the guests on an episode that was aired on September 8, 1992. Quite a fun performance! The two singers were in great voice and seemed to have a grand time swapping stories about their friendship and the "early years."

The conversation below, between Jerry Jeff and Jimmy, was about Phil Clark and A Pirate Looks at Forty. It's only a sample of the yarns spun that day:

JJW: We have a running buddy that we've known for a long time, I haven't seen him now in maybe 15 years... Phil Clark was his name. He was the bartender, when we were hanging out in Key West when we first got there. He was a real Pirate.

JB: Yea, he was the real Pirate.

JJW: You just knew it. He had that kind of breath and those eyes. (JB/Audience laughing)

JB: Phil Clark was the Bartender, and basically his system was - anybody he liked, the locals, he would always get the tourists that checked into the hotel pretty gassed up and then he would charge all of our drinks to them! (JJW/Audience laughs)

JJW: Definitely a Pirate!

JB: I love America, ya know! And um, he was really that, uh there was always something going on and he was either heading to Providenciales... He put words in my vocabulary that later became songs and stories about it. I remember seeing him sail away with his girlfriend one day off to some exotic island, and I was like: "I wish I could grow up to be a Pirate like him!" (audience laughing) and I didn't get to do that, but it sort of inspired all that old Treasure Island kind of stuff. You know I was always a young Jim Hawkins fan from way back. And Phil Clark died about 10 years ago...

JJW: Oh, that's why I haven't seen him!

JB: Yea, he hasn't been around...There's a happy ending to this story!

JJW: Well, if you hadn't told me that, I'd have thought he was still around! Every time I go to Key West, I look around...

JB: Well, I tell you what, if you'd like to see Phil, I mean in a way it's true, because his ashes are in an Urn atop the Full Moon Saloon cash register.

JJW: Alright!

JB: Yea, they brought him back there and they put...

JJW: Well, then...I HAVE seen him!

JB: You have seen him! He would laugh at this, believe me! (audience laughing throughout) This song has become, I guess, it's truly one of my favorites, and most people that have been with this music for all these years it seems to be their favorite, too. I guess we all wanted to grow up and be Pirates at some point and when we get to that point about where... it's not the best economic strategy at all, but, everybody seems to like to sort of snarl that line out, so your welcome... you know what I'm talking about, yea... (APLAF begins)

McAnally won the Country Music Association's Musician Of The Year honor an unprecedented seven consecutive times, and has written hits for a staggering number of mainstream country acts. BUTTERMILK PANCAKES WITH BOOZY BANANAS

Ingredients

1¼ cup all-purpose flour

1 Tbsp granulated sugar

1Tbsp Baking powder

½ tsp salt

1/3 c + 1 Tbsp butter

1¾ cup Buttermilk

1 egg

4 bananas

1/3 cup packed brown sugar

¼ cup amber or dark rum (Myers Dark Rum worked well)

½ tsp Cinnamon

The Method

Preheat oven to 150 degrees F

Combine flour, sugar, baking powder and salt in a large bowl.

Melt 2 Tbsp butter in a small bowl or sauce pan.

In a separate bowl, whisk together buttermilk, egg, and melted butter until smooth.

Grease a large non-stick skillet with just enough vegetable oil to coat the pan and place over medium heat until hot.

Spoon batter onto skillet to form pancakes and cook until edges bubble and begin dry. Flip and cook for additional 2 minutes or until golden. Remove to baking dish and place in warm oven and continue making pancakes until batter is used.

Meanwhile, slice bananas into ½ inch pieces and set aside. Melt remaining butter in medium non-stick skillet over medium heat. Add brown sugar and cook for 2-3 minutes or until sugar dissolves.

Add rum and cook for 2 minutes.

Add bananas and cinnamon and cook for 1-2 minutes until bananas are slightly softened.

Arrange pancakes on plates and spoon bananas over pancakes.

Serve immediately.

STICKY BACON

1 lb bacon

¼ c pure maple syrup

2 T Canadian whisky

Cook bacon in large skillet over medium-high heat until fat is reduced and bacon is almost crisp.

Drain fat and reduce heat to medium.

Add maple syrup and add whisky.

Cook until liquid thickens, about 1 minute.

Coat bacon in syrup and serve.



It's a different kind of head shop found just down the stairs from the Pike Place market.

It's the BB Ranch selling something that's even better than bacon. It's marijuana fed pork.

"The pig farmer has been feeding them marijuana for the last two and a half months of their life and they've been happy as hell," said William Von Schneidau, owner of the butcher shop.

This is all thanks the voters of Washington who legalized marijuana in the last election. That's when Von Schneidau saw the opportunity wasn't just blowing smoke.

"And then all of a sudden marijuana, you know, became legal a

few months ago and somehow, I don't know how, I met the commercial growers and they needed to get

rid of some of their stuff. So rather than going into the compost pile we said, 'Lets try it out.' So here we go," said he said.

The pigs are raised in a farm about an hour outside of Seattle. In fact, these pigs are on the rock star diet. The mix contains drugs and alcohol, the booze coming by way of the spent grains from Woodinville's Project V Vodka.

The pot pigs grow to be extra fat and really happy according to the farmer who wants to be anonymous.
