Relay For Life 2014 was a huge success for the Hanover area. The final total for the entire event was over \$227,000 and the goal was \$225,000. Our team, which was actually made up of five teams, the Hanover Area Parrot Heads, Bermudian Jaycees Angels, Barb's Angel's, Jane's Angels and IT Works, contributed over \$27,000 of that total. The Parrot Head team alone brought in over \$14,000 and was the number three fundraising team.

Relay For Life 2015 is off and running. We again have 5 teams registered with a total of 34 team members so far. If you want to join the Hanover Parrot Head team go to:

The committee appreciates all the help you offer. We will be having a Relay Rally on November 4th at South West High School to introduce Relay For Life 2015 starting at 6:00. Everyone is invited to attend. We, as a team, are again doing the activities for Relay and helping with the luminairia. 



JIMMY BUFFETT KNOWS A GOLDEN MARGARITAVILLE OPPORTUNITY WHEN HE CAN SELL ONE!

Jimmy Buffett knows one thing about marijuana users — there



are some folks who simply cannot roll a good joint. The Margaritaville mega-mogul also knows a business opportunity when he smells one. It could be why in January, Margaritaville Enterprises LLC tried to trademark the term “Coral Reefer,” the name of Buffett’s back-up band.

If granted, the trademark would

essentially give the “Cheeseburger in Paradise” singer a license to print (even more) money, through sales of branded products such as electronic cigarettes, electronic cigarette refill cartridges sold empty; smoking pipes, smoking pipe cleaners, smoking pipe racks, smokeless cigarette vaporizers, lighters and ashtrays.

It could also be the reason behind the Margaritaville corporate headquarters upcoming relocation to Orlando — home base of his good pal, uber-attorney John Morgan.

Margaritaville Enterprises LLC, a subsidiary of Margaritaville Holdings LLC, lists West Palm Beach as its principal address, but has a mailing address at the Loews Hotel in Universal Orlando.

In a profile on Morgan published last year, *Tampa Bay Times* reporter Adam Smith noted that the lawyer owns a piece of a Margaritaville casino in Biloxi.

Coincidentally (or maybe not), Morgan is also the mastermind behind United for Care, the most vocal supporters of Amendment 2, which seeks to legalize medical marijuana in Florida. By now, one would have to be really, really high not to connect these dots.

If Morgan is successful in convincing 60 percent of Florida voters to support Amendment 2 — a likely prospect given a May 2014 Quinnipiac University poll showing over 80 percent approval among all age groups — it would result in a Buffett bonanza, armed with a boatload of “Coral Reefer” branded e-cigarettes and other medical marijuana-related paraphernalia.

Don’t tell that to the U.S. Patent & Trademark Office, which issued a request for more information to Margaritaville officials in April. The letter stated, in effect, that if Coral Reefer products are for marijuana use — a substance still illegal by federal law — then there will be no trademark awarded.


However, if Buffett gets his trademark (maybe), and Amendment 2 passes, creating a marketplace for medical marijuana in the Sunshine State (probably), who knows what could happen next.

As the old saying goes: Where there’s (pot) smoke there’s ... a golden opportunity to sell Margaritaville vaporizers, ashtrays and lighters.

BUFFETT LAUNCHES MARGARITAVILLE TV

'It makes it a Parrothead World now, not just a Nation,' he tells Billboard.

Jimmy Buffett has found a new way to feed the Parrotheads this year: Margaritaville TV.

The new online channel streams select Buffett concerts live and, Buffett tells Billboard, has netted about 10,000 viewers for each of its seven broadcasts so far, with the next due Friday (July 25) from Detroit. "The feedback from that has been unbelievable," says Buffett. "There was one element of my inner circle that thought we'd be cannibalizing ourselves by going on television. But I played my instincts, and I haven't had one person say they'll watch it instead of going to the show. They do both. They watch the (online) shows and get charged up to go see it in person. And there are other people that can't get to a show that absolutely love the fact we're doing it. My friends in Bora Bora now can punch (the shows) up on the screen and watch it while they're having dinner. It makes it a Parrothead world now, not just a nation." And, Buffett adds, "I think it's the way you're going to get to see us in the future. The number of shows is going down. We're taking off a little more time every year. We're not going anywhere, but this way people can make it to any show, even if we're not playing around where they are."

Streaming concerts isn't all Buffett has in mind for Margaritaville TV heading forward. He predicts that other programming, including special events and archived shows that weren't presented live, will be part of the offerings, and it may also serve as a vehicle for releasing new music. "We can go into the (recording) studio and let people in there and watch us while we're doing it," Buffett notes. "We've got a lot of great variables we can do with it. We just have to figure out how we're going to pay for it -- subscription? Advertising? Both? So that's coming. The good thing is we're not out there looking for an audience. We've got one. We've got a million and a half, 2 million on Facebook. I know at Pandora, 200 people a day sign up for the Jimmy Buffett station there. So we can forget about trying to get on radio, 'cause that's not going to happen, and just use our own radio station and TV station to get to those people."

Buffett's last album, *Songs From St. Elsewhere*, came out in August 2013, and he says that since then he's been "playing around with some new songs," including one called "We Need to Care a Little Less," which he says is "about over-thinking, over-reacting to everything." Writing, he adds, is "a natural process. I'm not stopping writing," but he isn't sure if a conventional album will be the result. "For me, an album has just been adding something: if you like this music you can add it to the collection," he explains. "I'm not out there trying to win hits or chase Grammys or shit like that. I'm just trying to stay in the game at our level, so we're looking to find the best system for the next batch of new music."

Buffett's other new endeavor is in the wine world -- Auter deRose, whose purpose, he cracks, is "to get women in our bigger bars to stop drinking white zinfandel and drink a better wine. It's just from my days of liking rosé and 'can we make a decent rosé in America, 'cause there isn't one.' So I worked on it for about two years with guys I knew who were winemakers and we just did it and it came out really good."

JIMMY BUFFETT JUST ASKED FOR A RAISE

Some People Claim There's an Internet to Blame

The music business ain't what it used to be, Jimmy Buffett says and he's hoping to make more from the streaming-music business than he currently is. Buffett stepped to the microphone today at the inaugural Vanity Fair New Establishment Summit, where Spotify founder Daniel Ek was speaking, and asked whether the money he makes from presumably thousands of streams of "Margaritaville" and other hits will grow any time soon.

"Do you see any time in the future where we might see a raise directly from you as opposed to going through the bullshit you have to go through to deal with a label these days?" he said. "How the stream of revenue gets to the artist, particularly young struggling artists, it's really hard for that to actually happen in real life if you're a young artist. So I'd hope that all the music service groups would kind of look at that. It's one thing when it goes to the record label. Most of it doesn't get to the artist, which would be nice."



Ek was receptive to Buffett's question. "I agree," he said immediately. But he stopped short of saying Buffett would be getting a raise any time soon. Spotify will spend more than \$1 billion on rights this year, he said, and pays 70 percent of that to rights holders. "But it's actually still lower than what we used to get, right, Irving?" Buffett asked Irving Azoff, a legendary manager in the music industry, who was moderating the discussion. "That's why I'm looking for a raise." Azoff was unsympathetic. "Sell one of the planes," he told Buffett.

Buffett is hardly the first artist to complain about the fractions of a penny that they receive whenever one of their works are streamed. Thom Yorke, the Black Keys, and Bette Midler are among the performers who say they deserve more from Spotify. But given that record labels control most of the rights to their music, as well as the deals with Spotify and other streaming services, don't expect that to change any time soon.

WHAT I LEARNED IN GERMANY

I learned about *Reinheitsgebot*. On a trip to Germany for Oktoberfest I expected to learn about Beer, and of course I did. I already knew that it existed. Reinheitsgebot is the German purity law of 1516 which requires that German beer makers use only three ingredients in their beer: Barley, Hops, and Water. (in 1516 they didn't know that yeast existed). But I learned that doesn't limit the choices of good beer. Pilsners, Lagers, WeissBiers, Dunkels, and several others are prevalent in Germany all with their own subtle but unique flavors. Each brewery makes a special beer just for Oktoberfest, which is typically a little stronger than your usual German beer. I also was surprised to learn that it's pretty common in Germany to mix lemonade with beer, that's called a Radler and or Russ Bier. I guess even in Germany they understand the importance of pacing yourself.

I learned about *Findigkeit*. That is resourcefulness or ingenuity. A torrential downpour at the Augustiner Bier Garten didn't stop a group of resourceful Germans from enjoying their beer. They stacked tables to create a shelter from the rain and sat underneath them singing and toasting. We also saw a group of guys take a 10ftX10 ft table umbrella and carry it down the street to keep their group dry.

I learned about *Geschichte*. That is History. From the awe and wonder of the Neuschwanstein Castle built over a 20 year span by the order of King Ludwig II who died at the young age of 40 under suspicious circumstances before it was ever finished, to the Eagles Nest high in the alps where Hitler held meetings with his advisors, to the Church in the meadow which is well known in Germany for a weeping statue of Jesus, to Andechs Brewery and Monastery, one of the oldest breweries in Germany where monks have been brewing beer since 1455, to a fortress in Salzburg where the Archbishops retreated to hide from revolting townsfolk, and even the gazebo where one scene from the sound of music was filmed.

I learned about a how to do a proper *Prosit*. That is a toast. Never cross your glasses with anyone at the table always drink before you set your glass down, and always make sure that you look everyone in the eye as you clink your glasses together.

But most importantly I learned about *Gemutlichkeit*. This word transcends the English language as there is no single word in English that captures it's meaning in German. It packs all the meaning of coziness, a feeling of social acceptance, connection, friendship, unhurriedness, a clearing of your mind and leaving your troubles at the door into one word. It is sung in one of the most common German toasts at Oktoberfest:

Ein Prosit, Ein Prosit

Der Gemutlichkeit

Ein Prosit, Ein Prosit

Der Gemutlichkeit

A Toast, A Toast,

The Gemutlichkeit!



Most people in Germany were very friendly and welcoming. Of course beer tends to make people friends and break down barriers. There were people from all over the world in Germany for Oktoberfest. We found friends with people from Germany, Ireland, England, Austria, and even Russia. But the best part was being in Germany with a great group of friends and sharing the whole experience. That made the feeling of Gemutlichkeit very

real. **Prosit to all my travel friends!**

At Paulner, when Bill was taking orders. "I didn't know we were picking, I thought we were voting!"



ROASTED PUMPKIN FRIES

(EdNote: Since Punkin' Chunkin's been canceled, there's a huge supply of pumpkins available for mashing & fries!)



A favorite snack updated with a bit of seasonal flavor, these pumpkin fries are a tasty twist on ordinary fries. We love recipes that add in pumpkin where we least expect it; we'd heard of sweet potato fries, but pumpkin fries? Somehow it had never occurred to us to give this try! It doesn't get much more simple than this recipe, we're talking just a handful of ingredients and prep time around 15 minutes. Top these babies with crumbled blue cheese, maple balsamic, or whatever else you fancy. If you're a purist, they're plain delicious all by themselves. However you enjoy them, we promise you this: you'll be hooked!

Roasted Pumpkin Fries

(4 servings)

Ingredients:

1 pumpkin or most any squash

1/2 tsp salt

1 tbsp olive oil

1 tsp garlic powder

1/2 tsp ground cinnamon

Optional: crumbled blue cheese, maple balsamic, or other topping of your choice

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 F.
2. Slice pumpkin in half, then remove seeds. Peel off pumpkin skin using a potato peeler.
3. Cut pumpkin into 1/4-1/2 inch strips.
4. Mix together olive oil and seasonings in a bowl. Dip pumpkin strips in the bowl so they're coated in the mixture.
5. Place fries on a cookie sheet lined with parchment paper.
6. Roast fries for 15 minutes or until tender. Raise temperature to 400 F and broil the fries for another 3 minutes until they're nice and crispy.
7. Top fries with crumbled blue cheese, drizzled balsamic, or another topping of your choice. Enjoy!



The final studio album by the hit-writing country folk singer-songwriter with the universal touch.





Jesse plays acoustic guitar and keyboard and sings in his uniquely weightless tenor, there's an attuned rhythm section, and guest appearances by "newgrass" country Grammy winner **Jerry Douglas** on lap steel and legendary saxophonist **Jim Horn**, among others. Liner notes are provided by **Buffett**, an ardent Jesse fan.

"In my way of thinking, Jesse may no longer reside in the world of matter, but his energy sure as hell does. It is timeless and eternal and will be with us always from Montreal to Memphis, to those red skies off toward New Orleans..." **Jimmy Buffett**
